In January 2008, the Lord instructed Carola and Gilbert to reach the lost by going door to door in poor neighborhoods within their city. Soon they found out that the people they encountered not only needed Christ but also needed material provision. The Pagan's began to pray for the Lord to supply food and clothes. Just two weeks later, the Lord opened the windows of Heaven. The provision has been relatively consistent.

Good Seed Ministries regularly provides for families in need of food. Toys are given to children in early January. In addition, Health Fairs are offered, school supplies are furnished, and a Kids' Fiesta Day is organized in early May. With the help and support of Grace Christian Church in Cary they are a host site for Angel Food Ministries, a program that provides a box of food feeding a family of four for seven days for only \$32.
