

Camp Meeting Speakers

Reverend William (Billy) Wilson

Most recently, Reverend Wilson has been appointed as Executive Director of the Center for Spiritual Renewal and served as the Executive Officer for the Azusa Street Centennial. He also serves as International Minister of Outreach for both the Church of God and Church of God of Prophecy. Since 1994 Reverend Wilson served as the executive producer and host of World Impact as well as Voice of Salvation Ministries. Voice of Salvation Ministries is a weekly television broadcast now seen in all 50 states and more than 170 nations.

During more than 17 years of ministry, Reverend Wilson has also served as church administrator, international youth director, senior pastor and international evangelist ministering in crusades around the world. One of his more recent accomplishments is authorship of a book entitled **Fasting Forward: Advancing Your Spiritual Life Through Fasting**.

A native of Owensboro, Kentucky, Reverend Wilson graduated from Western Kentucky University with a Bachelor of Science in Secondary Education in 1979. He graduated from the Church of God of Prophecy Bible Training Institute in Cleveland, Tennessee, in 1983. He received his Master of Arts degree with a concentration in Evangelism and World Missions at the Church of God Theological Seminary in Cleveland, Tennessee, in 1997. He is a licensed bishop in the Church of God of Prophecy and his ministry credentials are fully recognized in the Church of God.

He and his wife, Lisa, currently reside in Cleveland, Tennessee. They have two children and three grandchildren.

Reverend Terry Tramel

Reverend Terry Tramel is a Professor of Bible and Theology at Southwestern Christian University in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He also writes for the Adult Sunday School Commentary for One Accord Resources in Franklin Springs, Georgia. Rev. Tramel has been licensed as a minister in the Pentecostal Holiness Church since 1979 and is a member of the Cornerstone Conference. He is a graduate of Mid-American Christian University in Oklahoma with a B.S. degree. Other educational achievements include an M.A. degree from Southern Nazarene University in Bethany, Oklahoma. Rev. Tramel has pastored several churches in the Heartland and Cornerstone Conferences. He and his wife, Beckie, have two children.

Reverend Joaquin Mercado

Reverend Stacy D. Hilliard

Reverend Stacy Hilliard currently serves as pastor for the Breakthrough Revival Center Church in Greenville, North Carolina and as the African American Coordinator for the North Carolina Conference. Reverend Hilliard grew up in St. Louis, Missouri and is also a native of Hazlehurst, Mississippi. He served four years in the United States Marine Corps. He is also an active Detective with the Greenville Police Department. Since, 1994, he has undertaken the tremendous as well as humbling responsibility of shepherding the Lord's people.

Pastor Hilliard, in keeping with his desire to serve the Lord with no inhibition, teaches and lives the doctrine of "hope in Christ". His ministry is not self-serving; but is one of reconstruction, revelation and dedication to the principles set forth by Jesus and delivered by the Apostles. His desire is that all people of God move into the true application of Jesus and unabashedly serve Him at all costs (chiefly to themselves) through sacrifice and submission to His will, as expounded upon in the scriptures.

For over a decade, he has made Greenville, North Carolina his home. He and his wife, Bobbie, have two daughters.

Reverend Frank Tunstall

Reverend Frank G. Tunstall serves as Bishop and Superintendent of the Heartland Conference in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He was the pioneer pastor of Northwest Christian Center in Oklahoma City and served that congregation for twenty-three years. He is a former editor in chief of publications and editor of the **Advocate** (the denominational official journal prior to the publication of **Experience**.) He also served for six years as president of Southwestern Christian University in Oklahoma City, and was a member of the World Missions Board for eight years.

During Dr. Tunstall's twelve-year tenure as assistant superintendent and missions director of the Heartland Conference, he led twelve short term missions trips, building churches and doing ministry in Central America, the Caribbean and South America. Two of the trips were to Communist Cuba. His newest book, **Our Awesome Lord**, written as a Christology, is currently being published, and will include a study guide and PowerPoint for teachers. He is also the author of **The Simultaneous Principle, a History of World Ministries**.

Frank and Lu have been married for 44 years. They have two children and five grandchildren. When he and Lu married in 1964, they lived in Fayetteville, North Carolina where he graduated from Methodist College. He also served as pastor at Elizabethtown Pentecostal Holiness Church, and in 1965-1966 led the church in building a new sanctuary.
