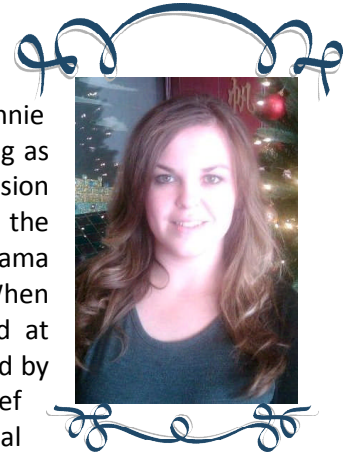


NCWM 2012 NEXT GENERATION LEADER
